November Happenings at Holy Cross... Thanksgiving & Community Sing Time...

Thanksgiving is just around the corner! During Community Sing Time this month, we will sing songs and hear stories about the first Thanksgiving, Pilgrims and Native American Indians. They are offering this service, to all of our families, to identify whether your child would benefit from a more thorough speech evaluation. A permission form will be (or already has been) sent home with your child. We must have that back, for your child to be screened. If you have been at all concerned about your child's speech, I highly recommend that you take advantage of this free screening.

Warm Clothes for Playground Fun...

We've had an absolutely beautiful first couple of months of school, but remember that the colder weather is right around the corner! The children will continue to visit the playground throughout the year.

Please dress your children in appropriate clothing for the colder weather, including sturdy shoes, hats and mittens. The children love to play outdoors and it is healthy for them to be out in the fresh air. We will keep the children in only if it is raining, snowing, sleeting or the temperature drops below 35 degrees Fahrenheit. If we can't go to the playground, the teachers will always try to use our gym space (in the back building), and will walk up there, using the covered walkway on the side of the church. Please help us out and label all coats, hats, mittens, etc. with your child's name.

Also, as the winter months approach, if your child is sick, please remember that they should be fever and symptom free (vomiting, diarrhea, etc.) for 24 hours before they return to school. Although a slight cough or runny nose is common, excessive coughing and/or discharge can spread germs quickly! We do appreciate a call or e-mail to let us know that your child will be absent, and a doctor's note is required to return to school following a contagious illness.
